

Design a Travel Brochure

Cities often offer a travel brochure—a tri-folded piece of paper featuring pictures and text designed to get people interested in coming to visit. Where does your character live? In the city? In the country? In a fantasy world? What do you imagine would attract tourists to this place?

Create a travel brochure designed to tell people all about your book's setting. (For an example of a travel brochure, call your local Chamber of Commerce and ask them to send you one.) You'll need two pieces of paper (8 ½" x 11"); crayons, markers, or colored pencils; scissors; glue; rub-on letters; and old photographs or old magazines.



Fold your first piece of paper into thirds. This will be the rough draft. On this piece of paper, sketch a design for your travel brochure. Include space for pictures, as well as plenty of room for writing.

When you have completed your rough draft, fold your other piece of paper into thirds. This will be the final draft. Cut out and glue pictures in designated places. Write text above and/or below the pictures. You might choose to use rub-on letters for an especially professional-looking brochure.

When you are finished with your brochure, display it alongside your book.
